STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS NO. 30 OF 2021

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT, CHAPTER 88 FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 17 OF THE CONSTITUTION, THE CABINET OF GRENADA MAKES THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS-

(Gazetted 21st July, 2021).

1. Citation. These Regulations may be cited as the

EMERGENCY POWERS (COVID-19) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 4) REGULATIONS, 2021,

and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (COVID-19) Regulations, 2021, SRO No. 3 of 2021 hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations".

2. Amendment of regulation 2 of principal Regulations. Regulation 2 of the principal Regulations is amended as follows–

- (a) by numbering the sub-regulation as sub-regulation (1);
- (b) by inserting after the sub-regulation the following new sub-regulation-
 - "(2) In these Regulations, a person is deemed to be fully vaccinated if-
 - (a) in the case of a type of COVID-19 vaccine requiring two doses, 14 days have elapsed since he or she received the second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine;
 - (b) in the case of a type of COVID-19 vaccine requiring one dose, 14 days have elapsed since he or she received the dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.".

3. Amendment of regulation 6 of principal Regulations. Regulation 6 of the principal Regulations is amended by inserting after sub-regulation (6) the following new sub-regulation–

SRO. 30 Emergency Powers (COVID-19) (Amendment) 2021 (No. 4) Regulations

- "(7) The Chief Medical Officer may grant a written waiver of the application of regulation 5 (1) in respect of a business, establishment or office, or a category of businesses, establishments or offices, if the Chief Medical Officer is satisfied that all members of staff are fully vaccinated and on the condition that no person would be permitted to enter the premises unless he or she is fully vaccinated.
- (8) Where a business, establishment or office to which a written waiver under sub-regulation (7) has been granted admits a person who is not fully vaccinated and does not comply with regulation 5 (1), the business, establishment or office commits an offence and is liable to the penalty imposed under regulation 14.".
